

## Con Edison Is 'On It' for the 2000 New York Subway Series

- Yankee Stadium and Shea Stadium use 3,500 and 4,500 kilowatts of power respectively.
- That's enough energy to power close to 3,000 residential apartments.
- Both stadiums:
- consume more electricity than Radio City Music Hall; and expend as much energy as it takes to power the American Stock Exchange each
  year.
- 2000 marks the 33rd year of the Con Edison/New York Yankees "Hall of Fame" Baseball program.
- Con Edison and The NY Yankees provide tickets to 11 games, without charge, to 30,000 youngsters (8-16 years of age) who live within the five boroughs and in Westchester County.
- Since 1969, the Con Edison/Yankee Baseball Program has provided free admission to Yankee games for more than 3 million youngsters.
- Willie Randolph, a third base coach for the Yankees, was a former Con Edison Yankee Kid and continues to participate in annual Yankee Kid kick off ceremonies.
- As part of the city's Office of Emergency Management response team, Con Edison will provide extra personnel at both stadiums.
