When electricity use is highest in our region, Con Edison will be able to control the thermostats to help save electricity and ensure continuous, reliable power throughout the region.

The goal of the program is to allow Con Edison to reduce electricity use -- not turn off the participating customers' central air conditioning systems -- when energy demand is highest. Participants also can override Con Edison's remote programming.
